

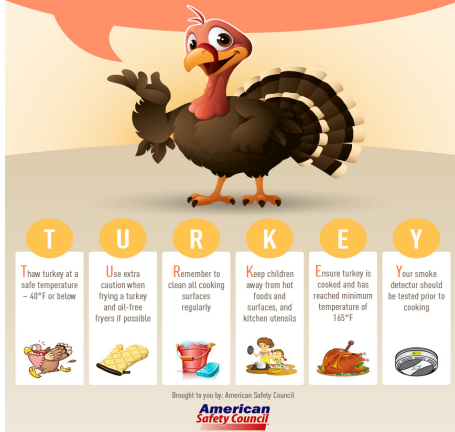

STAY SAFE THIS THANKSGIVING HOLIDAY

There's no bigger "Kill Joy" to your holiday celebration than an accident or a mishap that could have possibly been avoided if some basic safe practices were followed. To ensure a worry-free holiday, here are some Thanksgiving safety tips to keep your family and home safe:

HAVE A SAFE THANKSGIVING ~REMEMBER TURKEY!~



- Remove fall-related objects that might allow access to your home. For example, ladders for cleaning leaves out of gutters can be used to enter a window or scale a fence
- Don't post Thanksgiving travel plans on Facebook, Twitter or MySpace letting people know that you will be out of town
- Turn your telephone ringer down so no one outside can hear repeated rings; and review your answering machine message to make sure it does not imply that you are away
- Make sure to have all mail, newspapers, and deliveries stopped or picked up by a neighbor, friend or relative
- Never leave a key hidden outside. Burglars know all the best hiding places
- Secure all windows, including those upstairs and reduce the chance of easy entry by cutting tree limbs away from second-story windows
- Have a friend move your car occasionally if it is parked in the driveway
- Use timers to operate lights
- Consider installing a security system that includes a 24-hour fire monitoring service that automatically dispatches the fire or police department

• Also, consider installing a Web-based home security system, that allows you to check on your home while away and even arm and disarm your system from any laptop, cell phone, PDA or other Web-enabled devices

Thanksgiving is the leading day for home-cooking fires. Therefore, the National Fire Protection Association recommend these fire safety/prevention tips:

- Be sure to keep a fire extinguisher in the kitchen in case of emergency, and teach your family how to use it
- Be cautious when using turkey fryers as they pose a number of distinct safety concerns, including burn and fire hazards
- Never wear loose fitting clothing when cooking. Long, open sleeves could ignite and catch fire from a gas flame or a hot burner. Wear short, close fitting or tightly rolled sleeves when cooking. (Source: www.protection1.com)

IS WHOOPING CAUGH (PERTUSSIS) AMERICA'S NEXT EPIDEMIC?

Whooping cough or pertussis is highly contagious bacterial diseases caused by the bacterium Bordetella pertussis, and is spread through coughs and sneezes of the infected person. Symptoms similar to those of the common cold, runny nose, fever and mild cough are followed by weeks of severe coughing fits. It's named for the high-pitched whoop sound or gasp may occur as the person breathes after a coughing fit. The coughing can cause vomiting, ribs to break and a severe lethargy or tiredness. Infants may exhibit no cough but instead may have periods of breathing difficulty. Vaccinations aren't 100%, but do help to lessen the symptoms.

An estimated 16 million people in developing countries worldwide are infected annually. Legal immigrants are required to have medical screening to ensure that they do not bring any contagious diseases into the United States. Illegal aliens, however, are not screened and many are carrying horrific third world diseases that had, at one time, been eradicated in the U.S. Many of these diseases are highly contagious. Many Americans have been infected by contact in restaurants, schools, and police forces.

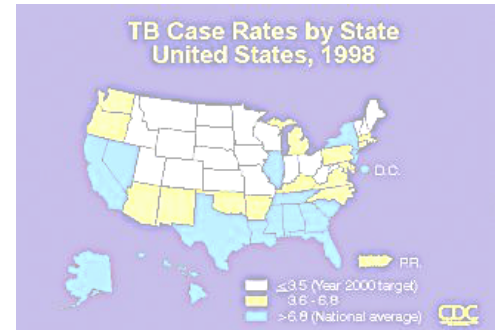
More, once rarely or nearly eradicated in the U.S., are reappearing:

Malaria - There were outbreaks in southern California, New Jersey, New York City, and Houston. Additionally, Malaria tainted blood has been discovered in the nations' blood supply.

Dengue - A leading cause of death among children in the infected areas in Asia, Dengue has been unknown in the U.S. until recently.

Leprosy - This Biblically-aged disease, caused by a bacillus known as Hansen's disease, has been diagnosed in 9000 cases since 2002; most victims are illegal aliens.

Hepatitis A - A viral infection that primarily attacks the liver, was attributed to 4 deaths in 2004 during an outbreak of Hepatitis-A from a single Chi-Chi's restaurant in Pennsylvania that infected more than 650 people. Hepatitis B - is a serious global public health problem from which an estimated 2-billion people are infected and about 1-million persons die each year. There is no vaccine to prevent Hepatitis C-E, and the vaccine for Hepatitis B is only 5% effective in preventing an infection and will not cure a person who is already infected. Lifelong side effects of Hepatitis are: cirrhosis (scarring) of the liver, liver cancer, liver failure, and early death. An estimated 1.3 million people in the US are currently infected.



Tuberculosis - TB is a highly contagious disease that kills approximately 2 million people each year. Like the common cold, it spreads through the air when infectious people cough, sneeze, talk or spit. Approximately 23,000 cases reported in Mexico in 2015, 10-times the global average, is eclipsed by many African countries along with Afghanistan, Cambodia, the Philippines, and Indonesia where the rates are 100 - 150 times higher. The U.S.' historically low rates are jeopardized, hopefully not by the new extensively drug-resistant XDR strain just being brought in by illegal aliens (now 4% of US cases), for which there is NO KNOWN CURE.

Recently, there was a TB Outbreak In Oklahoma City in a hospital affecting thousands. An illegal alien working in the hospital or an infected resident worker who became infected through contact with an infected illegal alien is believed to be the source of the outbreak.

HIV - The number of illegal Mexican and Central American immigrants with HIV or AIDS is unknown, mostly because researchers rarely ask about immigration status. However, it is known that the rate of HIV infection among Latino women in California is about twice the rate of white women. At one free California health clinic, all of the women have HIV or AIDS. Most are Mexican or Central American "immigrants."

These diseases, pathogens and parasites (Schistosomiasis, Guinea Worm Infection, Cysticercosis, Morgellon's, and others not endemic to the US), are also being brought in by unscreened illegal aliens who then spread them to an unsuspecting population.

UP-SURGE TREND OF ASSAULT/ ROBBERY, DISTURBING

During the 12-months from November 1, 2014 to October 31, 2015 the incidence of assault in the Sparta Valley area occurred at a rate of .53/1000 (93); a rate of .06/1000 (11) were aggravated assault for a total of 104 for an aggregate ratio of .60/1000 residents.

From November 1, 2015 up to October 31, 2016, the number of assaults reported in the Sparta Valley area rose to 105 for a rate of .60/1000. The incidents of aggravated assault remained steady at 11 (.60/1000), but the aggregate rose by 12 for a total ratio of .67/1000 residents.

More discerning is the sudden up-tick in the ratio of robbery. In November 1, 2014 to October 31, 2015 Robbery of Individual was reported twice for a rate of .01/1000.

As late as October 28th, a individual was robbed just 1/4 mile from our neighborhood near the 4000 address of Water Works Road. This was 1 of a total of 6 robberies reported during the 12-month period from November 1, 2015 to October 31, 2016 for a total of .03/1000 residents which is a 67% increase.
